Thank you for talking to a reporter today!

If you've received this guide, you've been asked by a reporter to participate in a news story. That makes you a "**source**" — of information, of insight, and of expertise!

Here's what happens next:

I'll continue reporting. I may need to talk to more people like you to learn more about this story or dive into data or public records. I may even need to follow up with you! If I do, I'll reach out.

We'll produce and edit. I'll take the information I learned and form a radio story. A producer and I will check it for any errors and make sure it's ready to go. Some sources, quotes, or clips may not make it into the final version, often because of space or time.

The story will be broadcast. Once it's ready, the story will air during one of our news programs. You can also find it online:
